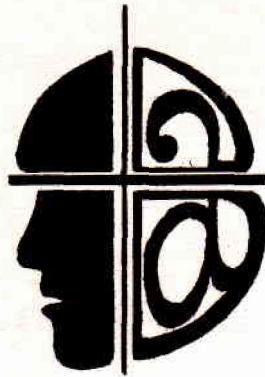

GLOBUS HYSTERICUS - A CASE REPORT

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A male patient of 45 years hindu by religion was admitted in Otolaryngology department of IPGMR for sense of obstruction in the throat during empty swallowing not relieving by any conservative treatment. But he did not have true dysphagia during solid or fluid intake. When the complain became severe he was admitted in the hospital. On both local and general examination he was found normal. All investigation reports were normal. Endoscopy and tonsillectomy done under G/A, histopathology report was normal, and he was discharged with explanation and reassurance and with common sense psychotherapy, with anxiolytics. Patients turned up and found improved on subsequent follow-ups. Discussion on case report and review of literatures will be done.
